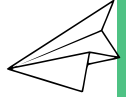

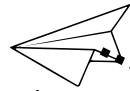

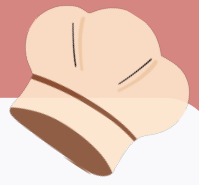
### **For WiFi (Good Idea):**

# CHILLA RECIPE



## Ingredients:

Chickpea flour (besan): 1 cup

Water: About 1 cup, or as needed

Mixed vegetables: 1 to 1.5 cups, finely chopped or grated. Common options include onion, tomato, capsicum (bell pepper), and spinach

Salt: To taste

## Method:

In a large mixing bowl, combine the chickpea flour, and salt.

Slowly whisk in about a cup of water until you have a smooth, lump-free batter with a pouring consistency, similar to pancake batter. You may need more or less water depending on the flour.

Let the batter rest for 10–15 minutes to allow the flour to absorb the water

Stir the finely chopped mixed vegetables,

Mix well until all the ingredients are evenly distributed. Add a little more water if the batter seems too thick after adding the vegetables.

Heat a non-stick pan over medium-high heat and brush it with oil or ghee.

Pour a ladleful of the batter onto the hot pan. Use the back of the ladle to gently spread it into a circular, thin pancake shape. Drizzle a little oil around the edges of the chilla.

Cook for 2–3 minutes, or until the edges begin to lift and the underside is golden brown.

Flip the chilla and cook the other side for another 1–2 minutes, until it is also golden and cooked through.

If you have cheese and fillings, add on top, fold and enjoy!

The book is moreover placed in New York, and a mystical place in the book called Alicante which is the capital of the Shadow Hunter world.

## **Spoilers** lay ahead, be aware

In the start of the book Clary lost her mom to Valentine, and her Sight gradually returned which is why she was able to see Jace and was invited to the Shadow Hunter world.

In total there are 6 books in this sequel. The first 3 books there is a war with Valentine and in the last three books they basically have to stop Clary's brother from basically burning the whole earth to the ground. This book is mostly fast paced which makes it highly interesting but if you dive deeper you will notice that the interesting part is in the mix of mysteries, romance, and action. Even small things like the mystery or the mix of Judeo-Christian and modern is what makes the book readable.

Comparing it to Harry Potter's 600 million books sold worldwide, Shadow Hunters only has 50 million, even compared to Percy Jackson that only has five books over 180 million copies sold. Even compared to the trilogy of Hunger Games that has 60 million. This book may not be the most read, but it stands as one of the best read books in my life.

This book has a series on it which does not follow the exact story line but it's a must watch. It has four seasons, each season with about 20 episodes which can vary from 30 to 1 hour. The first book has a movie named Shadow Hunters: City of Bones.



Trust and Reliability: Friends are loyal, honest, and don't lie. We can lean on them when we need support. They're reliable and the respect goes both ways—it's mutual. Being There Through Everything: True friends care when we cry or feel left out. They try to understand us and know when we're feeling down. They cheer us up and stay by our side even when we're not at our best.

Kindness and Care: Friends show kindness and truthfulness. They help with homework, spend time with us, and genuinely care about how we feel. Class discovered that years of friendship matter, but what really makes someone a real friend is how they make us feel—safe, accepted, and understood. Why Do Friendships Sometimes Change or End?

TODAY, BICYCLES HAVE DIVERSIFIED INTO MANY TYPES, LIKE MOUNTAIN AND ELECTRIC BIKES, AND CONTINUE TO EVOLVE.
